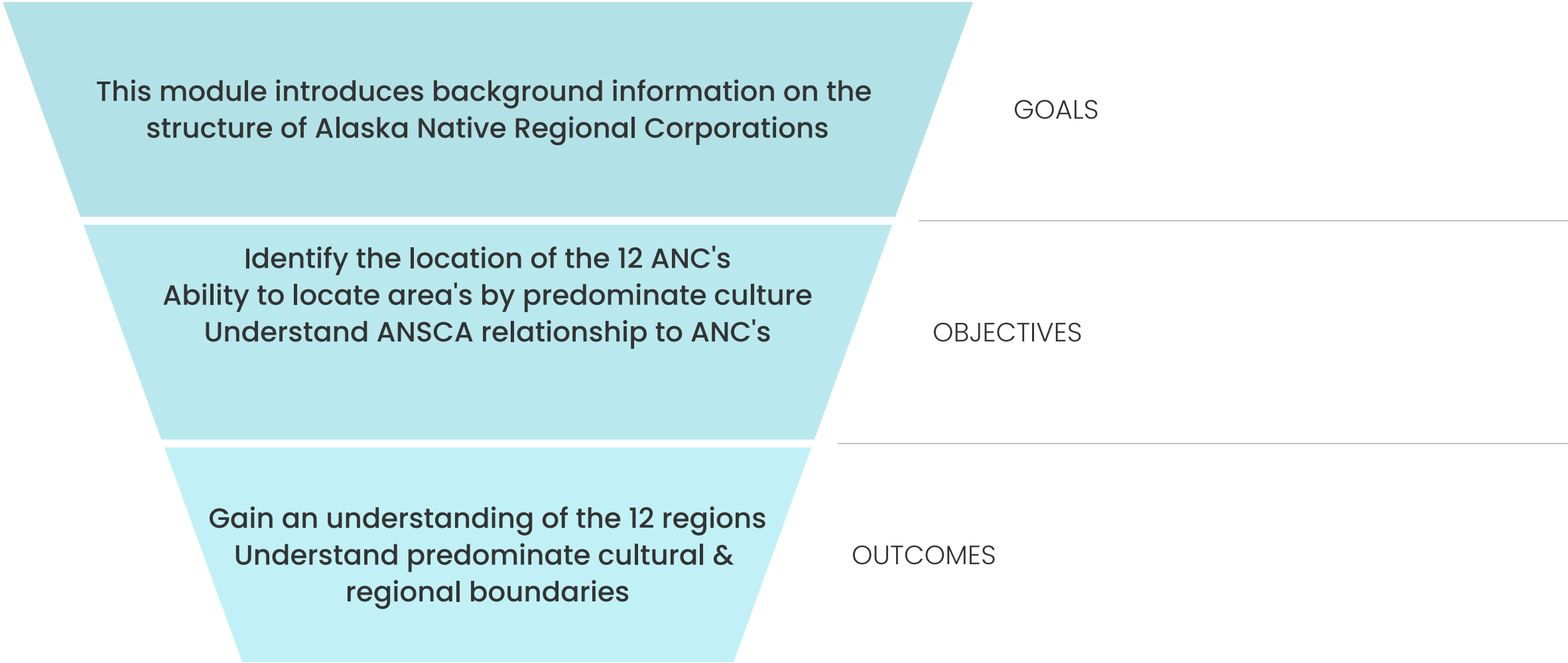

AN ACT

for the settlement of certain land claims of Alaska Natives for other purposes.

It enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That this Act be and it is enacted as the "Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act".

DECLARATION OF POLICY

SEC. 2. Congress finds and declares that—

(a) there is an immediate need for a fair and just settlement of all claims by Natives and Native groups of Alaska, based on aboriginal land claims;

(b) the settlement should be accomplished rapidly, with minimum delay, in conformity with the real economic and social needs of the Natives, without litigation, with maximum participation by the Natives in decisions affecting their rights and property interests, and without establishing any permanent racially defined institutions, privileges, or obligations, without creating a permanent dependency or lengthy wardship or trusteeship, and without interfering with the categories of property and institutions enjoying such protection under the legislation establishing special responsibilities of the United States Government and the Natives; and that the purposes of this Act shall be to

Alaska Native Regional Corporations

The U.S. Congress passed the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA). ANCSA divided Alaska into 12 geographic regions

Alaska Native corporations hold title to roughly 44 million acres of land held in private corporate ownership

ANC's retain the development rights of the resources beneath their lands. This affords the opportunity to create jobs, and other economic benefits to shareholders.

12 REGIONAL CORPORATIONS



ANCSA Section 7(i)

Section 7(i) requires that any annual revenues that an Alaska Native regional corporation receives from ANCSA lands (from timber resources or natural resources in subsurface estate) must be shared in a 70/30 split.

12 REGIONAL CORPORATIONS



ANCSA Section 7(j)

Section 7(j) ensures revenues from natural resource wealth are also shared with Alaska Native village corporations.

Section 7(j) directs ANC's to disperse 50 percent of the Section 7(i) revenues they receive to Alaska Native village corporations within the region.

ANC Revenues

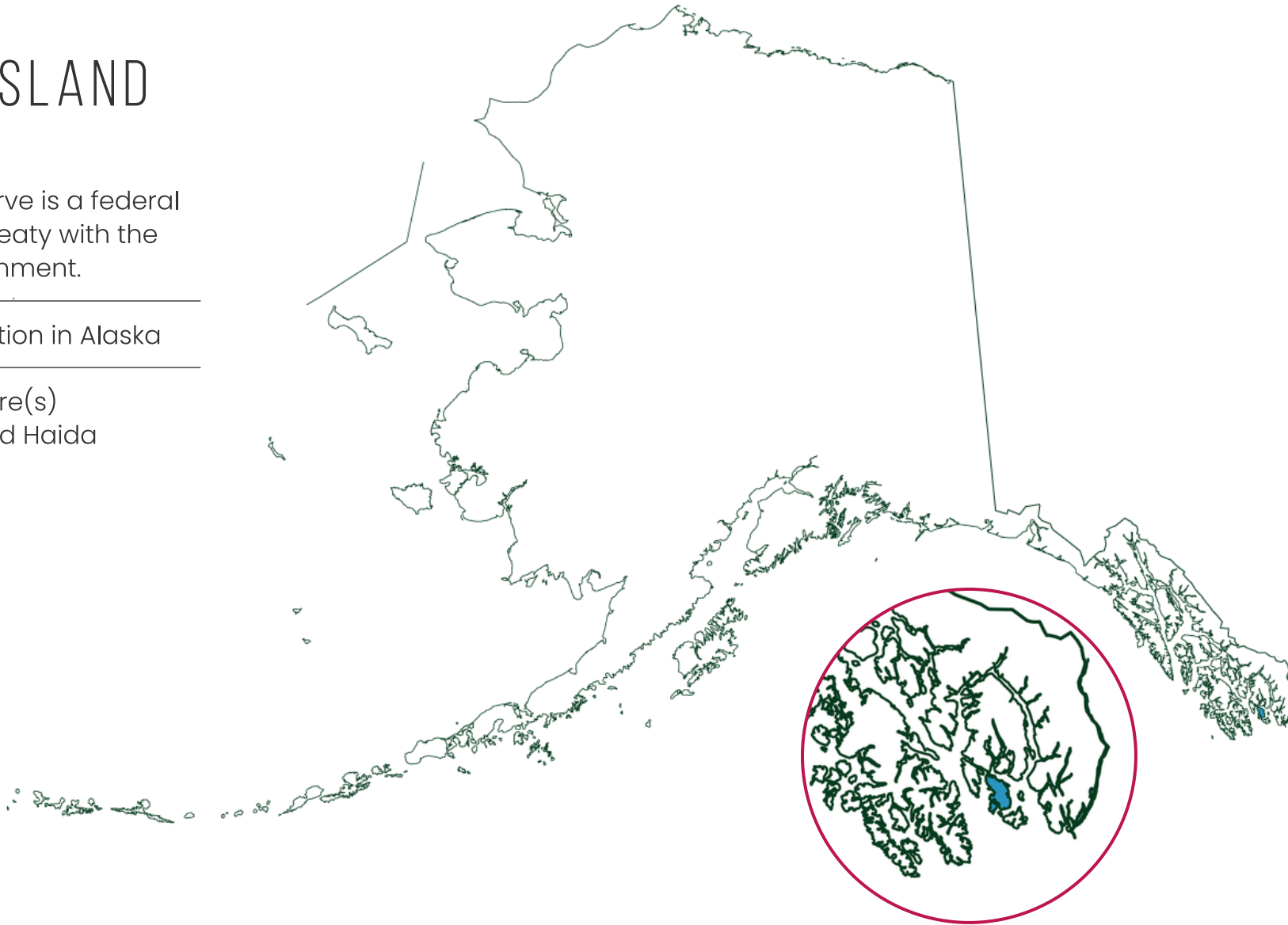
In 2019 ANC's reported \$10.5 billion in combined revenues. ANC's employ \approx 15,000 in Alaska with an estimated \$950 million payroll.

Annette Island Reserve is a federal reservation under treaty with the United States government.

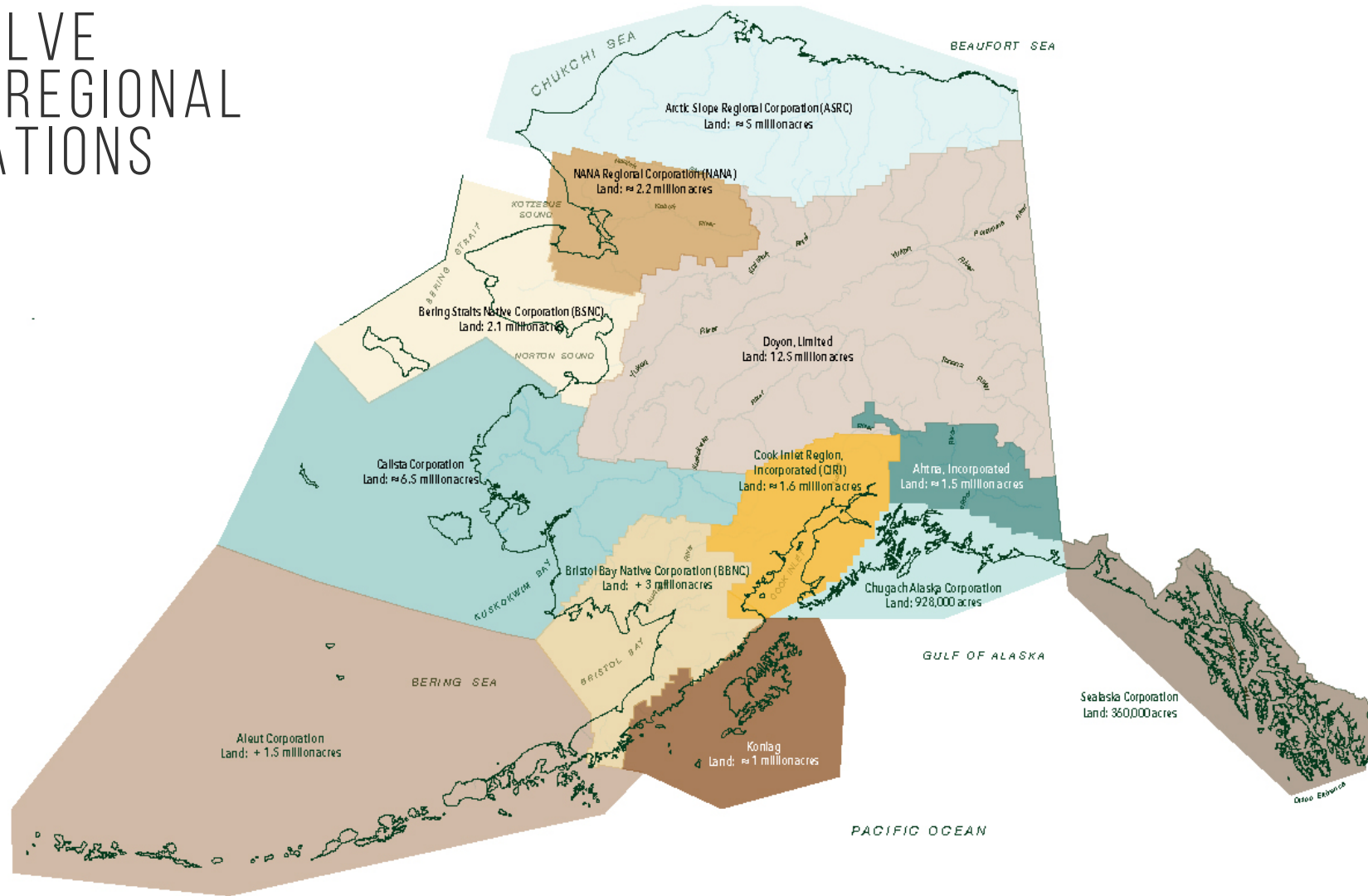

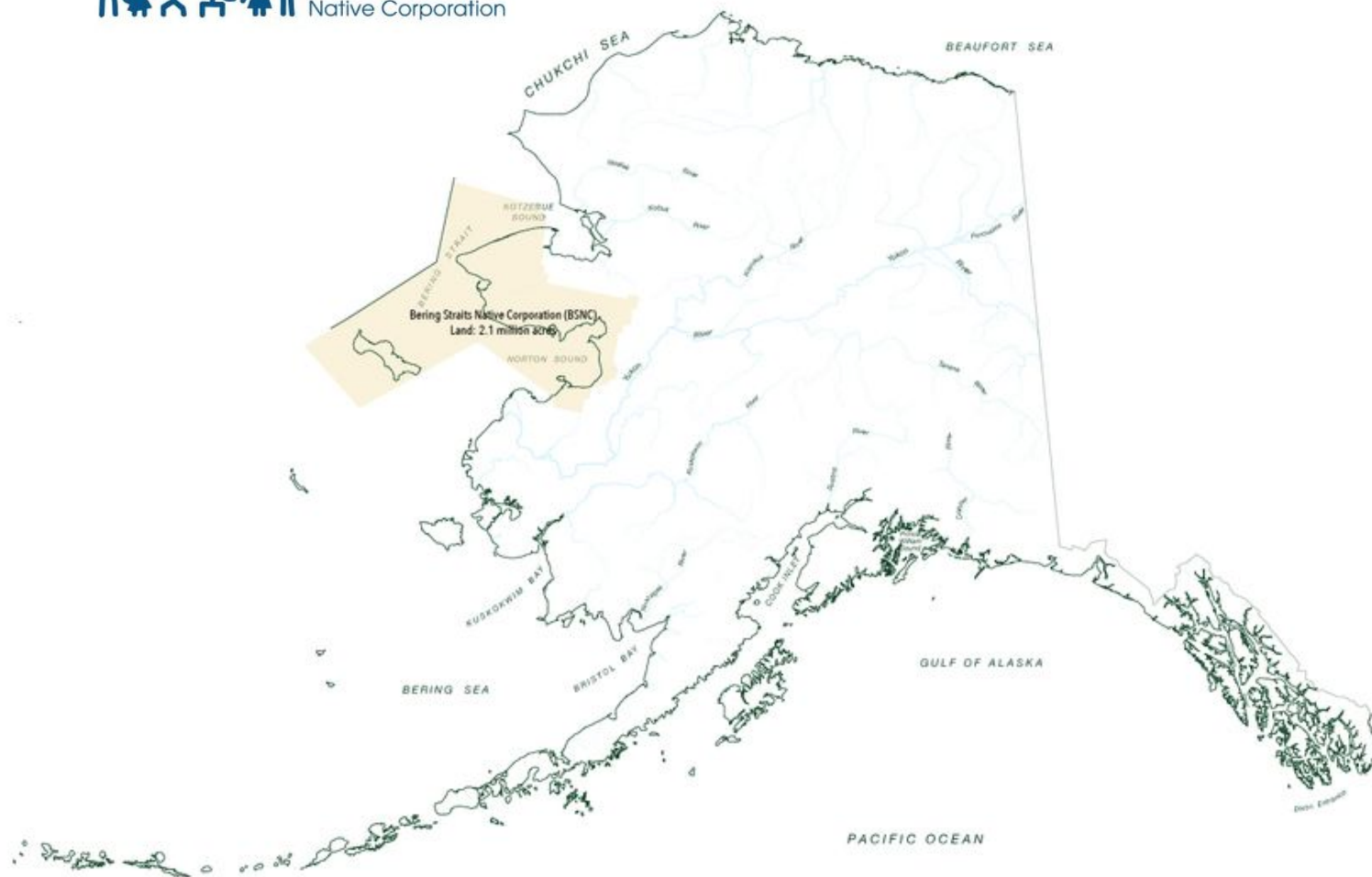
