Existing animal feeding operations are eligible for a cost-share rate of 60% for practices required for the proper design, implementation, and management of the animal waste system. Practices/components associated with all animal waste systems will be limited to \$130,000 of cost-share assistance for the system during the lifespan of the 2002 Farm Bill. Practices/components associated with irrigation conversions will be limited to \$75,000 per producer during the lifespan of the 2002 Farm Bill.
