The Local Work Group (LWG) requests the inclusion of the following **five** local resource criteria to be utilized for applicants requesting participation in the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP). These criteria will be used to evaluate and prioritize EQIP applications for funding and optimize the environmental benefits at the local level.

- 1. Does the EQIP application include implementation of practices that will increase plant diversity, health, & vigor or address energy conservation?
- 2. Does the EQIP application include practices that will either result in a crop rotation with a Diversity rating of 1.25 or better and/or promote the implementation of a three crop type rotation?
- 3. Does the EQIP application include Cropping System practices that will result in a STIR of less than 9?
- 4. Does the EQIP application provide for cover crops that will be used to improve soil health or soil erosion?
- 5. Does the EQIP application provide for a cropland management system with a stir of 6 or less AND a rotation of at least 2 crop types to improve soil health and organic matter?

If one of the above criteria does not meet your local resource concerns, please provide a recommended criteria and its inclusion will be considered.

- 4. Does the EQIP application offer to keep established perennial vegetation in grass and/or establish new perennial vegetation
- 5. Does the EQIP application include a grazing system designed to provide at least a 75% recovery period or contains practices that facilitates a grazing system?
