





Reasons for deletion:

The activity was not really an enhancement over common practice.

Simply too easy with little environmental benefit.

- PLT12 Patch Harvesting
- SQL07 FSI for Soil Quality

- WQL23 Livestock Protection Away from Sensitive Areas

Rules for Bundling

- Bundles made from existing enhancements.
- Each bundle includes at least five enhancements.
- Bundles positively address at least three resource concerns including Air Quality, Water Quality, and Animals (Wildlife).
- Bundles are land use specific.
- Bundles are scheduled as system approach and a conversion factor is used to convert all units to acres.

Rules for Bundling

- All elements of the enhancement bundle must be scheduled by the third year of the contract.
- Enhancement bundles are scored based on the extent to which the enhancements address each micro-resource concern.
- Bundles are compensated by annual payments as additional activities.

Bundles

- 7 Bundles
 - 3 on Cropland
 - 1 on Pastureland
 - 1 on Rangeland
 - 2 on Forestland

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
