## NEW ASSISTANT STC FOR TECHNOLOGY BACK WHERE HE STARTED

Ron Davidson, the new assistant state conservationist for technology, started his career with SCS in the mid-70's working as a soil conservation technician in the Provo and Cedar City Field Offices and later as a soil conservationist in the Tremonton Field Office. He then moved to Idaho in 1980 where he spent the majority of his career as a district conservationist.



Prior to joining the state office staff, June 26, he was assistant state conservationist for operations in Hawaii. Hawaii has one field office on each of the islands of Kauai, Oahu, Maui, Molokai; three offices on the Big Island of Hawaii; and one in American Samoa. The Hawaii State Office also provides leadership and support to islands within the Pacific Basin (Guam, Chute, Saipan and Plough). "So, I spent a lot of time in airplanes and hanging around airports," he reports.

"Utah NRCS has an excellent technical staff and I am very pleased to be a part of that team. I look forward to meeting you and working together to protect our natural resources," said Davidson.
