

Supplementary information: The environmental assessment of this federally assisted action indicates that the project will not cause significant local, regional, or national impacts on the environment. As a result of these finds, Eric B. Banks, State Conservationist, has determined that the preparation and review of an environmental impact statement are not needed for this project.

The project purposes are to address human health and safety and continued flood damage reduction. The planned works of improvement include the rehabilitation of Spring Creek Watershed Floodwater Retarding Dam R-1, located southwest of Garden Plain, Kansas.

The Notice of Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) has been forwarded to the Environmental Protection Agency and to various federal, state, and local agencies and interested parties.
