

**ADDENDUM for COMMERCIAL SHOOTING PRESERVES
on CONSERVATION RESERVE PROGRAM (CRP) ACRES
Mowing of CRP Cover on
Commercial Shooting Preserves on CRP Acres
as Outlined in FSA Notice CRP-380**

This addendum is a part of the Conservation Plan of Operations (CPO). It was developed by Farm Service Agency (FSA), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), and Kansas Wildlife & Parks (W&P). It will serve as the State approved management plan for habitat maintenance, wildlife, and land management on those CRP acres which are operated as a Commercial Shooting Preserve licensed by W&P. Recognition of mowing limits on Commercial Shooting Preserves involving CRP shall be noted in the CRP CPO.


Any action undertaken on CRP, regardless of the commercialism of the acres must fall within the CRP practice and program limits. Actions taken outside said limits will be considered violations of the CRP contract.

Commercial Shooting Preserves are permitted to mow CRP cover, not to exceed 20 percent of the total CRP acres in a field in any one year, and with the following stipulations:


- Mowing shall not be performed until after August 15, for optimum wildlife, cover, and land management.
- Following any mowing operation the remaining stubble height shall not be less than 6 inches.
- In the interest of wildlife, cover, and land management, mowed residue may need to be removed from the mowed areas. If removed it must be done with prior FSA approval. Removed forage must be destroyed without benefit. Its destruction shall be approved and witnessed by FSA personnel.
- The mowing location in each field shall be changed from year to year, so that the same area of each field mowed is not mowed in consecutive years. No more than 20% of each field can be mowed each year.
- Mowing will be accomplished in consideration of cover maintenance, vigor of the grass stand, and land management, all of which will provide erosion control, water quality, wildlife and habitat benefits.
- In addition to mowing for hunting enhancement, mowing shall be accomplished in consideration of identified noxious weed control program needs. Noxious weed control measures during nesting season can be accomplished only with prior approval from FSA County Committee after consultation with NRCS and W&P.
- Management of habitat, cover and land shall be done in full consideration of all game species that are normal to CRP type cover and area of the State where the CRP resides.

Burning shall be performed if called for in the CPO. It shall not occur during the identified nesting season. Prior to burning, NRCS shall confirm that it will not damage the CRP cover nor cause wind or water erosion in excess of acceptable limits.


