

WETLAND RESTORATION/OFF-CHANNEL HABITAT ENHANCEMENT

NRCS priorities for WRP for the next few years are in the Willamette valley and Southwest Oregon.

Planning can start now for when North Coast does become a priority, projects will be lined up.

Current Wetland restoration projects can be funded through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) but the project and focus area must be tied to a NRCS implementation strategy at the county level.


