
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The Five–Step OJT Cycle for Declarative Training (Knowledge)

Cycle step 1	Trainer and trainee review the objectives and agree on the purpose of this module.
Cycle step 2	<p>Have trainee:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Review NRCS cultural resource information available on the NRCS web site at: NRCS /Technical Resources/Natural Resources Assessment/Cultural Resources • Review NRCS endangered species information from any available source locally.
Cycle step 3	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Provide trainee with name(s) and contact information of state Cultural Resource Specialist(s) (CRS), Cultural Resource Coordinator(s) (CRC), State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO), and/or Tribal Historic Preservation Officer (THPO) and anyone who may have responsibilities in regards to endangered species. 2. Open the attached NRCS NCRP Handbook excerpts related to soil survey activities.pdf, excerpted from the National Cultural Resource Procedures Handbook (NCRPH). Provide location and description of any known endangered species sites in your survey area.</p>
Cycle steps 4 & 5	Answer any questions from the trainee and make sure the trainee is comfortable with differences.
