



Recordkeeping

Records are essential elements of all nutrient management, pest management, and waste utilization plans developed in Louisiana. NRCS' nutrient management (590) and waste utilization (633) conservation practice standards require that records of nutrient and or waste application be kept for a minimum of 5 years. Our pest management (595) standard requires that records of pesticide application be kept for a minimum of 2 years.

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Recordkeeping is an important part of farm management. Good records enable producers to perform different analysis that may prove useful for future decision making. Records also enable NRCS personnel to document the proper application of these conservation practices by producers.

The Nutrient, Pesticide, and Agricultural Waste Application Recordkeeping Worksheet on the opposite side of this job sheet provides a uniform method for documenting the application of nutrient and pest management and waste utilization that will be used in all NRCS field offices in Louisiana. This form will help ensure that these practices are applied according to conservation practice standards and specifications contained in Section IV of the Louisiana Field Office Technical Guide.
