Missouri State Issues

12	The planned Wildlife Habitat Appraisal Guide (WHAG) Community Model index value for the offered acres is 0.70 or higher.		
13	Practices in this FY10 WHIP application address basic habitat requirements of bobwhite quail on 50% or more of the offered acres.		
14	Offered acres are within, or adjacent to, the buffer area of a federal or state listed threatened or endangered species AND practices in this FY10 WHIP offer will impact the recovery or protection of the species.		
15	Practices in this FY10 WHIP application include the establishment, management, restoration, or habitat manipulation of a native plant community of three or more plant species on a minimum of 50% of the offered acres.		
16	Practices in this FY10 WHIP application address prairie, glade, savanna/woodland, wetland, riparian or bottomland forest restoration or management on at least 50% of the offered acres.		

Local Issues

17	Declining habitats (glade, savanna, open woodland or prairie) are restored (according to guidelines in the 643—Restoration and Management of Declining Habitats Standard) on at least 10 acres or over 50% of the offered acres.		
18	Offered acres are located within an identified Quail Focus Area and/or an identified Conservation Opportunity Area.		
19	Application addresses all three basic habitat requirements on at least one 40 acre tract, or the entire area offered if less than 40 acres. Basic habitat requirements are defined as a minimum of 0.1 acre of dense woody cover, 10% in diverse wildlife-friendly nesting/brood-rearing cover, and some type of disturbance (disking, prescribed burning, etc.).		
20	The application includes conversion to wildlife-friendly herbaceous cover on at least 10 acres; OR the control of known infestations of sericea lespedeza, autumn olive, purple loosestrife and/or teasel on all offered acres.		
21	The application will result in livestock exclusion from 75% of perennial streams or 75% of woodland acres.
