### APPLICATIONS FOR THE USDA-NATURAL RESOURCES CONSERVATION SERVICES'S ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY INCENTIVES PROGRAM DUE NOVEMBER 19, 2010

ATHENS, GA, (October 15, 2010--James E. Tillman, Sr., State Conservationist for the USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) in Georgia today announced that the 2010 Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) applications are due by November 19, 2010 to be considered for funding this fiscal year.

Applications can be taken at all NRCS offices and USDA Service Centers. EQIP is a voluntary program that funds conservation practices based on state identified natural resources concerns, such as forestry, grazing, soil erosion, water conservation and water quality. There are about 60 EQIP conservation practices including, but not limited to: pasture and hayland planting, heavy use areas, waste storage facilities, terracing, pest management, tree planting, organic crop assistance, and wildlife habitat management. This list will vary based on locally prioritized conservation practices.

EQIP was originally established under the 1996 Farm Bill. It provides technical and financial assistance to landowners to voluntarily address soil, water and related natural resource concerns on private lands. Conservation plans must be developed for the entire area that will be included in the EQIP contract.

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NRCS provides leadership in a partnership effort to help people conserve, maintain and improve our natural resources and environment.
