


### Helpful Hint—Add a Practice Note to the Map

**Background:** Sometimes it is more meaningful to display a note on the plan map regarding a practice rather than the practice number or name. With Toolkit 5.3, SP-3, the user can now do this with little difficulty.


**Procedure:**

1. Add a Practice (line), Practice (point), and/or Practice (polygon) layer to your Arc Map project.
2. Attribute each practice and include a note describing the practice. For example, if trees are going to be planted, you could list the number and species.



3. When you've attributed all of the practices, click OK.
4. Set the map scale to the scale at which the map will be printed, e.g. 1:7920.

- Click on the Label tool icon (green paintbrush); select the layer you want to label; and an appropriate label style. In the Label Description Field select Notes, and click OK.



- When prompted, click OK to make an annotation layer. If all goes well, your labels will now be displayed.
