

CSP Eligibility, Qualification & Application Steps

You've decided you want to apply for the Conservation Security Program (CSP). Now what? Once you've determined you are interested in CSP, you need to complete a number of steps to determine if you meet the basic eligibility criteria and if you are qualified for the program. Individuals who have an existing resource management system level plan with the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) may have already completed a number of these steps. Check with your local NRCS office to determine which steps you need to complete.

1. Complete the Producer Checklist for initial eligibility.

This will allow you to determine whether or not you meet the initial eligibility requirements for the program without completing a comprehensive assessment.

2. Attend an Informational Meeting on the CSP program and the program requirements.

This will provide you with the information you need to determine if CSP is right for you and your farming/ranching operation.

3. Attend an NRCS Self-Assessment and Record Keeping workshop.

This will help you work through the self-assessment process and help you collect and record the documentation needed for making the CSP application.

4. Get a USDA Identification Number.

If you have worked with USDA farm programs in the past, you most likely have a USDA Identification Number (also referred to as a SCIMS number). If you do not have a USDA Identification number, the process is very simple. Just contact your local NRCS office to set up a time to receive a number.

5. Arrange an interview with NRCS to determine the CSP categories, sub-categories and tiers for your operation.



6. Apply for CSP and submit your Conservation Stewardship Plan.

Your plan will be submitted to the NRCS National Headquarters, where funding selections will be made. All applications in Category A will be funded first, followed by categories B, C, etc. until this year's funds for the program are depleted. You will be notified by mail once selections are made.

7. Complete Your Conservation Stewardship Contract.

If you are selected, you will also be contacted by your local NRCS office to finalize and sign your Conservation Stewardship Contract.
