Animals Enhancement Activity – ANM22-Restoration and Management of Rare or Declining Habitats

ATTACHMENT A – Montana Enhancement Activity Sheet Supplement

The following habitats, described in Conservation Practice Standard, Restoration and Management of Rare or Declining Habitats (Code 643), are eligible for this enhancement:

1. Fescue grasslands in western Montana valleys.
2. Sagebrush steppe in southwest and central Montana.
3. Old growth ponderosa pine forests in the Northern Rocky Mountains and Intermountain West.
4. Northern mixed grass prairie – Brown Glaciated Plains.
5. Northern mixed grass prairie – Northern Dark Brown Glaciated Plains.
6. Riparian forests.
7. Hardwood draws.
8. Glacial potholes.

Seeding/planting mixtures and rates will be determined by the local NRCS Field Office. At least three species of *native* grasses and/or sedges and two species of *native* forbs and one *native* shrub will be seeded/planted as appropriate for the site. These species will be selected from the applicable Ecological Site Description located in the Electronic Field Office Technical Guide (eFOTG).
