


Easement Program Obligations

FY-12 Obligations = \$19,762,000




Wetland Reserve Program funding

FY2013 Easement Programs

- Grassland Reserve Program
 - No funding for new enrollments
- Wetland Reserve Program
 - \$12.4 million
- Healthy Forests Reserve Program
 - \$1.3 million

Changes to WRP Environmental Site Evaluation

- Moved Ranking Question to Screening Question
 - 30 Year Applications and Cost Share Agreements
 - Can be ranked later
- Replaced Ranking Question with Timber Quality Question
 - Points for NO timber harvest in last 3 years
