1. Turn on your Global Positioning System (GPS) unit. If it is connected to your computer, disconnect it.
2. If you have not updated your Geodata Tools, double-click the **Shortcut to Geodata Tools** on your computer desktop and click on the **Tools** tab.
3. Click on **Update Workstation Tools** to update your computer to the latest Geodata Tools version.
4. On your GPS unit, click **Start** (at the top of the screen) and then click **Setting** (at the bottom of the screen).
5. There are 3 tabs at the bottom of the screen; **Personal**, **System**, and **Connections**. Click **Connections**.
6. Click on the **USB to PC** icon.
7. Uncheck the **Enable Advanced Network Functionality** box.
8. Connect the GPS unit to your computer.
9. In the lower right of your computer screen, a pop-up message will appear that displays that it is configuring the device. Ignore this message. It should disappear after a few seconds.
10. A **Window Mobile Device Center** pop-up screen will appear. Click on **Connect without setting up your device**.



11. If the software license pop-up screen appears, click **Accept**.



12. Your GPS unit is now configured for Windows 7 and you should have the screen shown below on your computer. You do not have to do anything with this screen, just click on the **minimize button** to hide it.



If you lost your **GPS_manager-Shortcut** from your desktop, complete these steps to restore it:

1. Open Windows Explorer and navigate to the following directory:
C:\geodata\project_data\nrcs\tools
2. Right click on **GPS_manager** and click on **Create shortcut**.
3. Click on **GPS_manager-Shortcut** and drag it to your desktop.
