

SUPPLEMENTAL WATERSHED WORK PLAN AGREEMENT NO. II

(hereinafter referred to as the Sponsoring Local Organization)

Soil Conservation Service
United States Department of Agriculture
(hereinafter referred to as the Service)

Whereas, the Watershed Work Plan Agreement for Lower Plum Creek Watershed, State of Texas, executed by the Sponsoring Local Organization named therein and the Service, became effective on the 29th day of June 1961; and

Whereas, the Supplemental Watershed Work Plan Agreement for Lower Plum Creek Watershed, State of Texas, executed by the Sponsoring Local Organization named therein and the Service, became effective on the 3rd day of June 1966; and

Whereas, in order to carry out the watershed work plan, as supplemented, for said watershed, it has become necessary to modify said Watershed Work Plan Agreement, as supplemented;

Whereas, it has been found necessary to modify the Watershed Work Plan Agreement, as supplemented, to comply with the provisions of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 (Public Law 91-646, 84th Stat. 1894);

Now, therefore, the Sponsoring Local Organization and the Service hereby agree upon the following modification of the terms, conditions, and stipulations of said Watershed Work Plan Agreement, as supplemented:

1. A paragraph numbered 5 is added to the Supplemental Watershed Work Plan Agreement to read as follows:

The Sponsoring Local Organization will provide relocation advisory assistance services and make the relocation payments to displaced persons as required by the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies

Act of 1970 (Public Law 91-646, 84 Stat. 1894) effective as of January 2, 1971, and the Regulations issued by the Secretary of Agriculture pursuant thereto. Prior to July 1, 1972, the Sponsoring Local Organization will comply with the real property acquisition policies contained in said Act and Regulations to the extent that they are legally able to do so in accordance with their State law. After July 1, 1972, the real property acquisition policies contained in said Act shall be followed in all cases.

The Service will bear 100 percent of the first \$25,000 of relocation payment costs for any person, business, or farm operation displaced prior to July 1, 1972. Any such costs for a single dislocation in excess of \$25,000 and all costs for relocation payments for persons displaced after July 1, 1972, will be shared by the Sponsoring Local Organization and the Service as follows:

^{1/} Investigations have disclosed that under current conditions the project measures will not result in the displacement of any person, business, or farm operation. However, if relocations become necessary, relocation payments will be cost-shared in accordance with the percentages shown above.

2. The Sponsoring Local Organization and the Service further agree to all other terms, conditions, and stipulations of said Watershed Work Plan Agreement, as supplemented, not modified herein.

Gentlemen:

On January 2, 1971, Congress enacted Public Law 91-646. The act is cited as the "Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970." The act is to provide for uniform and equitable treatment of persons displaced from their homes, businesses or farms by Federal and Federally assisted programs and to establish uniform and equitable land acquisition policies for Federal and Federally-assisted programs.

The act is effective January 2, 1971 and is applicable to the Lower Plum Creek Watershed. The law and regulations of the United States Department of Agriculture issued to implement Public Law 91-646 requires the work plan agreement entered into between you and the Service and which became effective on June 29, 1961 and the supplemental watershed work plan agreement which became effective on June 3, 1966, be amended to include those provisions of the law applicable to "Federally assisted programs."

We have prepared an amendment to the work plan agreement as supplemented for your consideration and execution. This law and the United States Department of Agriculture regulation is new to us and will be to you. To assist you in better understanding the intent of the attached amendment and how it will affect you, we enclose a copy of USDA Regulation Title 7 Part 19, a copy of the Watershed Protection Handbook Interim Notice 2-6 with explanatory attachments prepared by the Service, and a copy of Watersheds Memorandum SCE-113.

We have requested Area Conservationist Alanson W. Brown and District Conservationist J. T. Ward to deliver this letter and the enclosures to you and review them with you. After you have reviewed the material, we will be glad to provide additional information, if needed.



We request that you execute the Work Plan Agreement Amendment as soon as you are in a position to do so. No additional works of improvement can be installed with Federal assistance until we have your assurance of compliance with applicable provisions of the law, as stated in the proposed work plan agreement amendment.

Please provide us with four signed copies of the amendment for execution by the Service. When executed by the Service, a copy of the executed amendment will be provided to each sponsoring organization.
