

SUPPLEMENTAL WATERSHED AGREEMENT NO. III
 CLEAR CREEK WATERSHED
 of the Trinity River Watershed
 Denton, Wise, Cooke and Montague Counties, Texas
 BY
 EXCHANGE OF CORRESPONDENCE

Since the original Watershed Agreement was signed on the 24th day of May, 1960, and subsequent supplements since, it has become necessary to modify that agreement in order to carry out the installation of the plan.

Minor revisions by letter correspondence have added and deleted various floodwater retarding structures and grade stabilization structures. Actions to date include the installation of all structural measures with the exception of Floodwater Retarding Structure No. 44C. The accelerated land treatment assistance and the planned land treatment have also been completed. Installation of these measures have reduced the resource problems in most of the watershed. The purpose of this supplement is to further modify the plan at the request of the sponsoring local organizations. This supplement will delete Floodwater Retarding Structure No. 44C. The sponsors requested the deletion of the floodwater retarding structure because landrights could not be obtained at the present location and no acceptable alternative location could be found. This supplement will also delete Denton-Wise Soil and Water Conservation District as a sponsoring local organization and add Denton County Soil and Water Conservation District and Wise Soil and Water Conservation District as sponsoring local organizations due to the re-organization of the districts.


The floodwater damage benefits will be reduced from 82 percent to 79 percent by the deletion of the structure. The sponsors are willing to accept the reduction in benefits to the work plan by the deletion of this structure.

All other terms, conditions and stipulations of the watershed agreement not modified here remain the same and are agreed to:
