Purpose:

The purpose of this visit was to transport and delivery a trailer and an 80 MHz radar antenna to Jim Turenne. The trailer has been stored on block in a large enclosed storage space since 1988. The National Soil Survey Center (NSSC) was interested in removing this trailer so that Jim Doolittle (Research Soil Scientist) could store his geophysical equipment in a smaller, less expensive space. Jim Turenne notified the NSSC staff that he was interested in the trailer for storage and transport of the equipment he uses to survey sub-aqueous soils. An 80 MHz antenna (model 3112; serial # 048) is stored and transported in the trailer and is no longer being used by Jim Doolittle. The 80 MHz antenna with two transceivers (a model 705DA (serial # 106) and model 705DA2 (serial # 129) were transferred to Jim Turenne during this brief visit.
