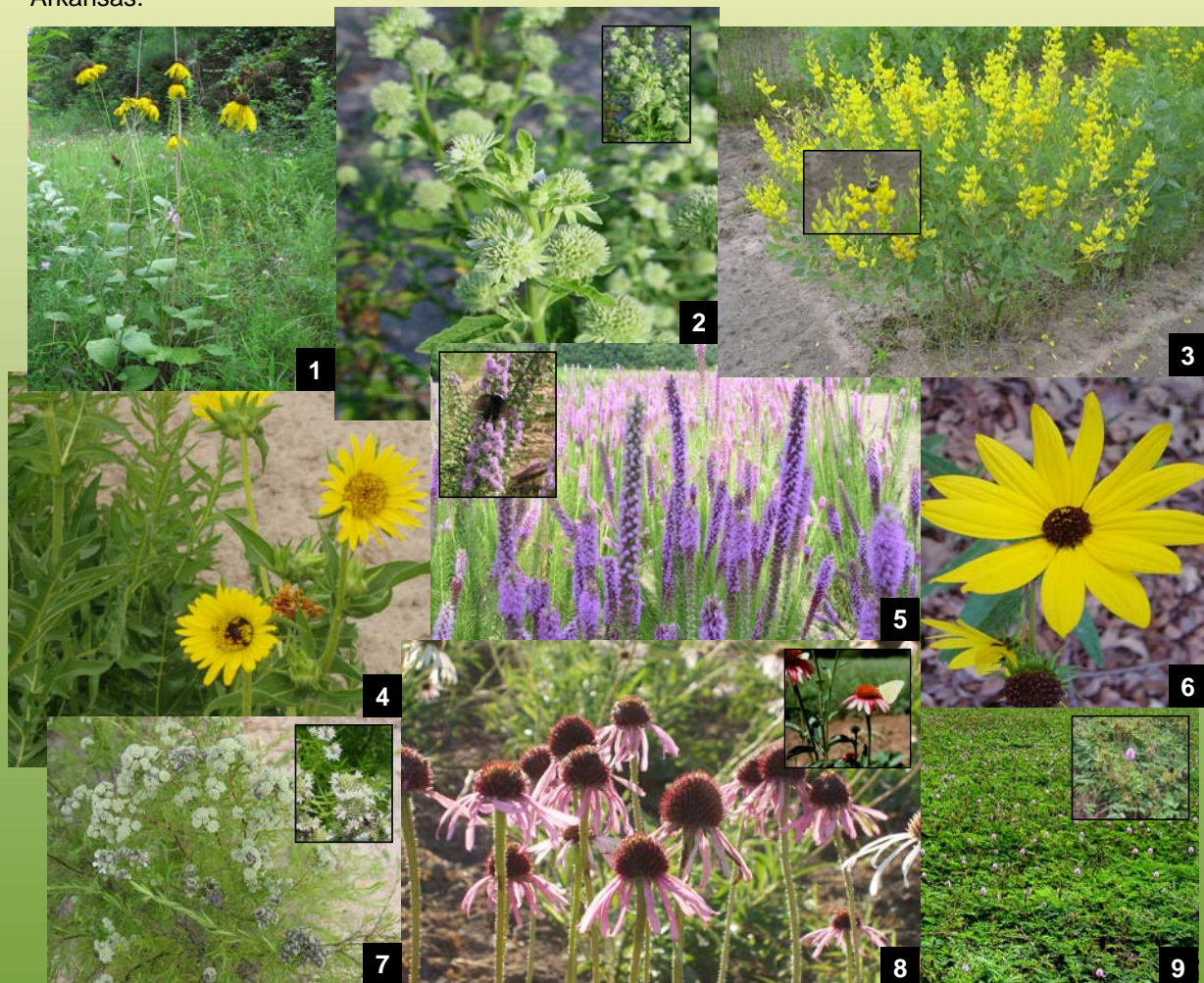


Plants for Pollinator Habitat

- 3 yellow wild indigo (*Baptisa sphaerocarpa*)
- 4 compass plant (*Silphium laciniatum*)
- 5 gayfeather (*Liatris pycnostachia*)
- 6 swamp sunflower (*Helianthus angustifolius*)
- 7 slender mountain mint (*Pycnanthemum tenuifolium*)
- 8 purple coneflower (*Echinacea pallida*)
- 9 powder puff (*Mimosa strigillosa*)
