Clarifications:

1. The cubic foot (CuFt) payment unit is the capacity of the incinerator or invessel drum.
2. The square foot (SqFt) payment unit is the are of the structure or pad.
3. For the “Invessel Rotary Drum” activities, the static secondary treatment areas/bins (if used) are included in the cubic foot (CuFt) payment for the invessel drum.
4. The “Static pile” activities that include “with hydrant” have a hydrant installed at the static pile to be used for moisture control.
