

Workload Prioritization Worksheet: **ABC #2245 RCPP Land Management**

A Workload Prioritization Worksheet must be completed for each eligible ABC #2245 RCPP Land Management application in Wisconsin.

This workload prioritization worksheet must be completed for each eligible producer applying for ABC #2245 RCPP Land Management (LM). Applications will be accepted on a continuous basis; however, application periods are established for purposes of evaluation, ranking, and funding decisions. The goal of this tool is to ensure that conservation technical assistance and the RCPP program benefits are managed efficiently to address priority conservation needs related to this initiative.

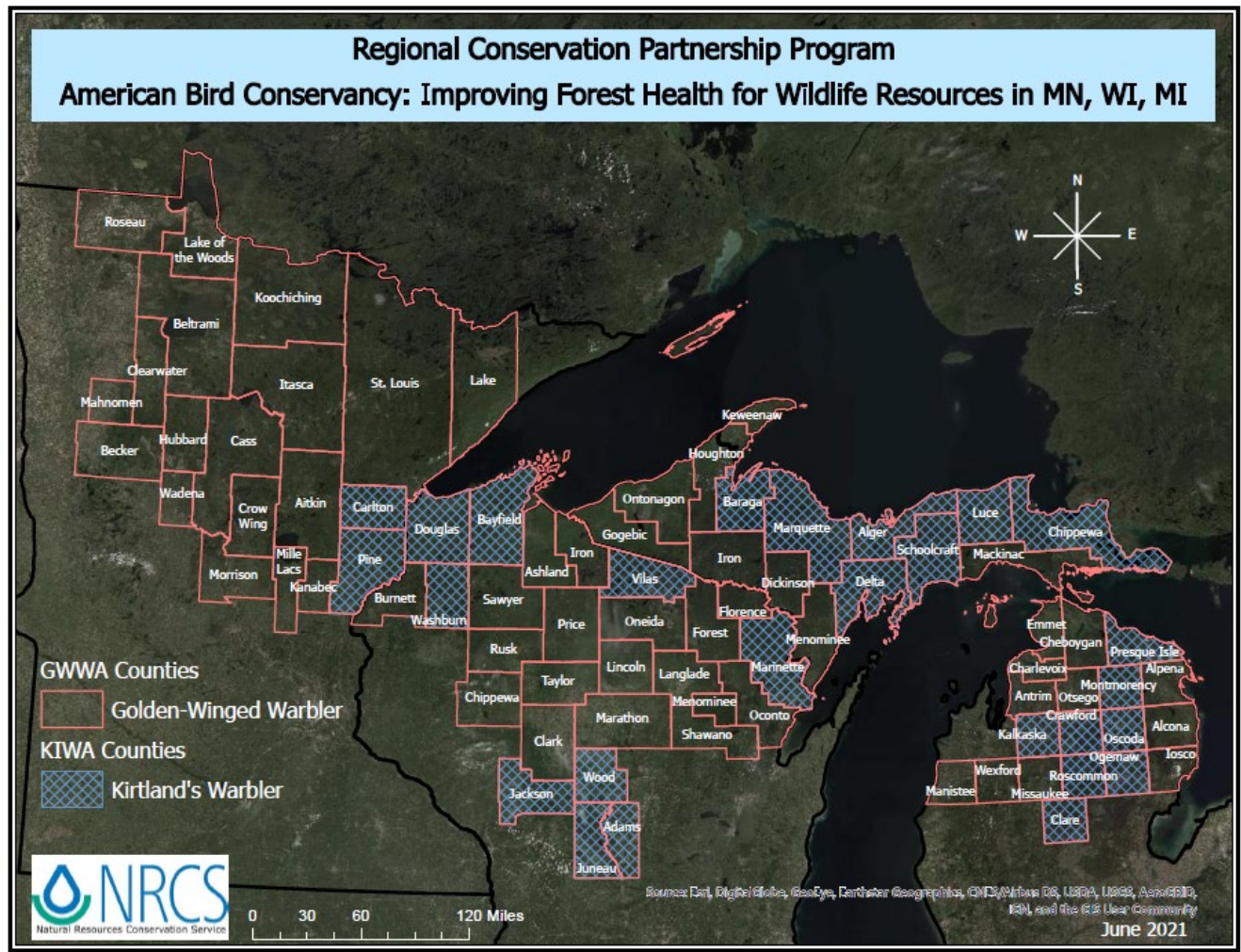

The original worksheet should be filed with the applicant case file or RCPP program file and unless the application is determined to be ineligible, the screening priority (high, medium, or low) must be recorded in CD. <p><u>High Priority Category:</u> Within the project scope, this application will address the Terrestrial Habitat resource concern by implementing a CPA 106 and/or DIA 165 on land beneficial to GWWA or KIWA habitat, OR</p> <p>will result in GWWA upland early successional habitat with a treatment block > or equal to 5 acres, has the potential to contain 2 or more age classes after treatment, and has a forest composition of northern hardwoods within the stand, OR</p> <p>this application will result in improved Kirtland’s Warbler breeding habitat of at least 40 acres in size and within, adjacent to, or very near 300 acres of suitable habitat for a Treatment Block.</p>	High
<p><u>Medium Priority Category:</u> Within the project scope, this application will address the Terrestrial Habitat resource concern by implementing shrub wetland early successional habitat with a treatment block > or equal to 5 acres, has the potential to contain 2 or more age classes after treatment, and has a shrub composition > 75% speckled alder with at least 50% of the surrounding forest of proposed treatment area comprised of deciduous trees.</p>	Medium
