Cove-East Fork Virgin River Watershed Project – Kane County, Utah

Public Scoping Notice

United States Department of Agriculture

Project Information

The U.S. Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), with assistance of the Kane County Water Conservancy District as the project sponsor and Washington County Water Conservancy District as the cosponsor, is considering proposed improvements within the East Fork Virgin River Watershed. The proposed improvements include a new water storage facility (Cove Reservoir), or an alternate reservoir site, as well as other improvements associated with the Mt. Carmel, Glendale, and Orderville irrigation systems.

NRCS is holding a virtual public meeting, via Zoom to provide information about the proposed project and to collect comments. Supplemental technical studies are scheduled to take place during fall 2021, with a Draft Watershed Plan – Environmental Impact Statement (Plan-EIS) circulated to the public and agencies for review in mid-2022. The Plan-EIS will further evaluate the proposed project along with any viable project alternatives in accordance with the rules and guidelines of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ).

The Plan-EIS is being funded under the NRCS Watershed Flood Prevention and Protection Program (PL83-566), which provides both technical and financial assistance to help communities protect, improve, and develop water and land resource in watersheds up to 250,000 acres.

Project Background

Initially known as the "Cove Reservoir Watershed" project, alternatives and associated impacts were analyzed in a Watershed Plan-Environmental Assessment (Plan-EA); however, after careful project review and consideration of comments received on the Draft Plan-EA presented in winter 2020/2021, the NRCS has initiated the preparation of a Plan-EIS.

Improvements under consideration include water conservation, water storage, agricultural and municipal demands, public safety risks, and increased opportunities for public recreation in the East Fork Virgin River watershed.
