



American Bird Conservancy: Improving Forest Health for Wildlife Resources in MI, MN, and WI – 2018 FB RCPP Project #2245

Project Description/Summary:

The Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP) is a partnership that leverages capabilities and resources, targets assistance where it is most needed, cooperatively engages project partners, and works collaboratively with agriculture producers, forest land managers, and Tribes. This RCPP project will promote voluntary, incentive-based conservation on private and Tribal lands. This project is part of a cooperative, full life cycle, international initiative to restore Golden-winged (GWWA). Government agencies and private conservation organizations have a strong interest in preventing the unnecessary and potential listing of Golden-winged (GWWA) under the Endangered Species Act. Together, MI, MN, and WI have the largest remaining breeding population of GWWA in the world and have critical ecosystems to rebuild populations rapidly. The GWWA, identified as a species of greatest conservation need (SGCN) in the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), State Wildlife Agency, Joint Venture, and other conservation organization plans, needs quality young forest with mature forest nearby to breed and successfully raise young. The Kirtland's Warbler (KIWA) is a conservation-reliant SGCN recently listed as federally endangered. This project seeks to improve young jack pine stands to increase KIWA habitat. Objectives of this project are to implement focal species best management practices (BMPs) on private lands through RCPP technical and financial assistance from 2021 through 2025.

Project Area:

The project must intersect the boundary of the 2245 ABC Project Area; ranking will be set to implement these boundaries. See map at the end of this document.

Eligible Land Management Producer Contract Land Uses:

Crop*, Forest, Pasture, and Associated Ag Land
*Crop is only eligible for the purpose of planting Jack Pine to benefit KIWA

Eligible Resource Concern Categories:

Terrestrial Habitat

Habitat Suitability Indexes:

Unique Habitat Suitability Indexes (HSI) have been developed for the Golden-winged Warbler and Kirtland's Warbler.

Eligible Land Management Practices:

The Schedule of Operations must include at least one of the applicable core practices or must be completing a conservation system that supports core practices that are documented as already implemented on the land proposed in the application and identified in the CART assessment as historical or observed practices.

Application Processing:

RCPP is a stand-alone program and requires its own NRCS-1200 application separate from other NRCS FA programs. All 2018 Farm Bill (FB) RCPP applications will be continuously accepted, and signup cut off dates will be publicly announced each year. For Land Management and Rental producer contracts, question 2 of the NRCS-CPA-1200 Conservation Program Application (version October 2021) should be marked "Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP)". Write "2245 ABC RCPP LM" in box 2a (see NB 300-22-8). 2018 Farm Bill RCPP applications will be managed through Conservation Desktop. USDA Financial Assistance Eligibility will need to be determined manually with the Farm Service Agency's Subsidiary Report.


