Brianne Lowe	<ul> <li>Recommendation #1: Add March to the dormant seeding dates for native plantings (Current dormant season dates are December through February)</li> <li>The committee discussed dormant seeding expansion earlier into fall. There are not enough data to support dormant seeding into November, but the wildlife professionals are seeking real world examples and data to study.</li> <li>Recommendation #2: New species added to 420 calculator: October 1, 2023</li> <li>Grasses/Graminoids: Broomsedge, Softstem bulrush</li> </ul>			
	<ul> <li>Wildflowers/Forbs/Legumes: Yarrow, Late boneset, and Prairie Sundrops.</li> <li>Josh briefed background of promotion for Broomsedge being added and benefitting wildlife.</li> <li>Suggested field days across the states within November and December.</li> <li>Aggressive grasses discussed: Indiangrass, Big bluestem and Switchgrass.</li> <li>Field days to expand education and demonstrations (virtual and in-person)</li> <li>Research resources available for gradual transition.</li> <li>Interseeding:</li> <li>Hearing within Indiana and nationwide the struggles with interseeding.</li> </ul>
