

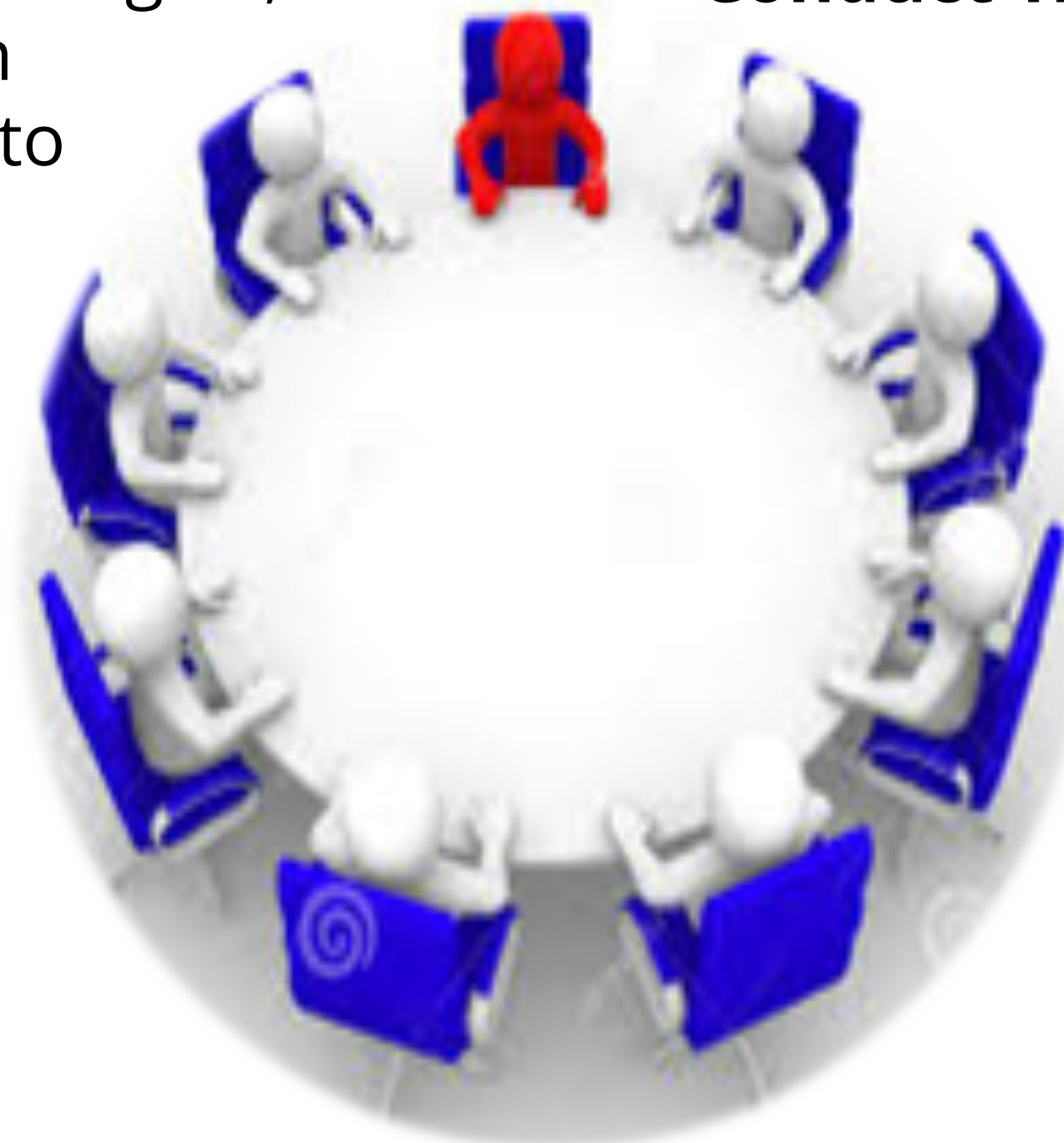
The Texas Regional Conservation Partnership Program Roundtable

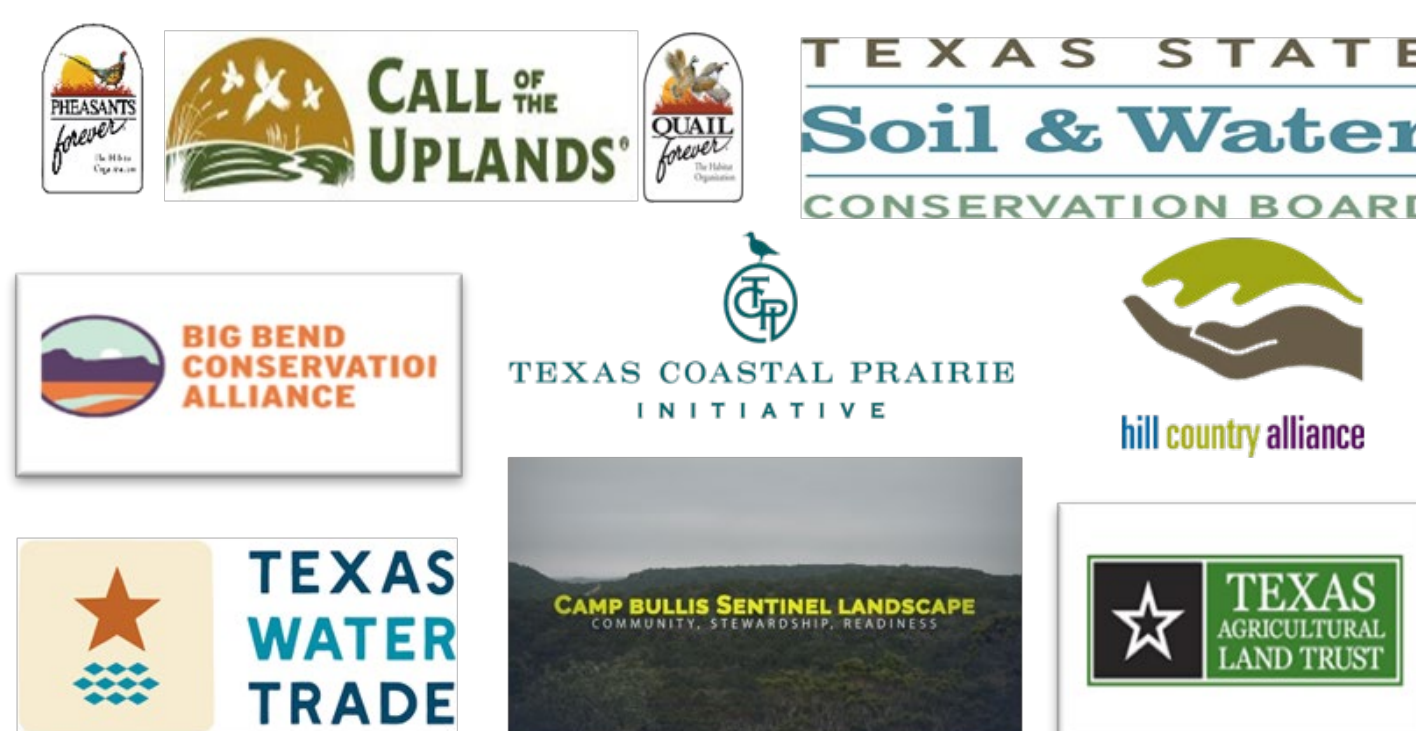
