	 "Question about the Source Water Protection Areas. I noted new areas have been added and some areas have gone from just surface to surface and groundwater. Would you please explain how these new and broadened areas affect landowners in those areas? What should they expect? Is there anything in particular they need to do? Thanks, Becky Joniska, IN State Poultry Association."

	Answer (from Shannon Zezula):		
	"Great question, Becky – farmers in these NRCS Source Water Protection Area priority watersheds are eligible for our base Farm Bill programs, but they receive additional priority ranking if they are addressing a water quality resource concern. They are also eligible for higher payments for certain High Priority Practices that improve water quality. The only thing they need to do is visit their local USDA Service Center and get in touch with their local NRCS District Conservationist to get a conservation plan in place to identify opportunities to improve the water quality leaving their farms."		
IRA Climate Smart Ag and Forestry Practices/Activities (Slides Attached) Shannon Zezula (Mike Hughes presenting)	 Mentioned that Climate Smart Ag and Forestry Activities are a major component of IRA financial assistance.
