

DOES YOUR CONSERVATION PROJECT QUALIFY FOR OUR ACTION NOW FUNDING PROCESS? ASK YOUR NRCS REPRESENTATIVE!

ACT NOW allocations and are subject to change based on eligible applications in each fund pool.

For certain Farm Bill program opportunities, the NRCS in Colorado offers applicants two avenues to receive financial assistance, the traditional funding process, and the ACT NOW process.

- FY-24 EQIP Traditional Funding Opportunities - NRCS's traditional funding process involves the installation of more complex practices and systems which require more planning and design.
- FY-24 EQIP ACT NOW Funding Opportunities - NRCS's ACT NOW process allows producers the opportunity to apply for applicable NRCS funding and potentially know if their project will be funded in an expedited manner. These projects involved less complex practices and limited design.

WHAT IS A THRESHOLD – A threshold is a state determined minimum ranking score in a designated ranking pool.
