

Upper Sevier Watershed Plan- EA Project Garfield Co, Utah

Scoping Notice



Project Information

The United States Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service (USDA-NRCS), with the assistance of Garfield County, Utah as the project sponsor and the West Panguitch Irrigation Company is considering a set of proposed improvements within the Upper Sevier Watershed. The proposed improvements include the development of a watershed plan for the Sevier River, the replacement and possible rerouting of an aging and undersized irrigation pipe, and the expansion of an existing running trail to support a multi-use recreational trail.

Improvements under consideration will address flood control and protection and agricultural demands, while enhancing species habitat.

USDA-NRCS will hold a hybrid (in-person and virtual options) public meeting to provide information about the proposed project and to collect written comments.

Additional Information

At this time, USDA-NRCS is requesting comments on the project to identify issues and resource concerns. Written comments are due within 30 days, postmarked by May 3, 2024.


