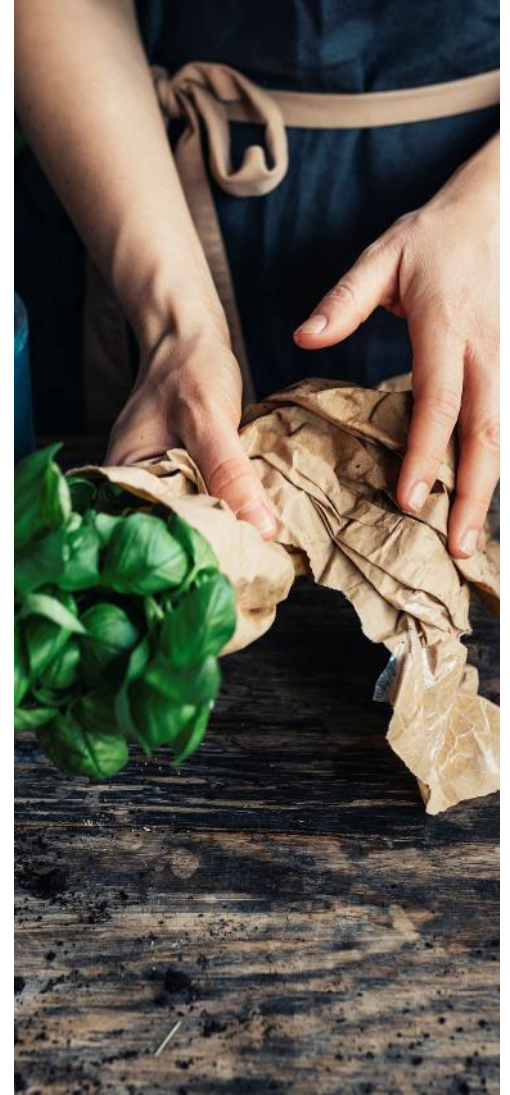

 - Members are agricultural producers who are within urban/suburban setting located throughout the state of NV.



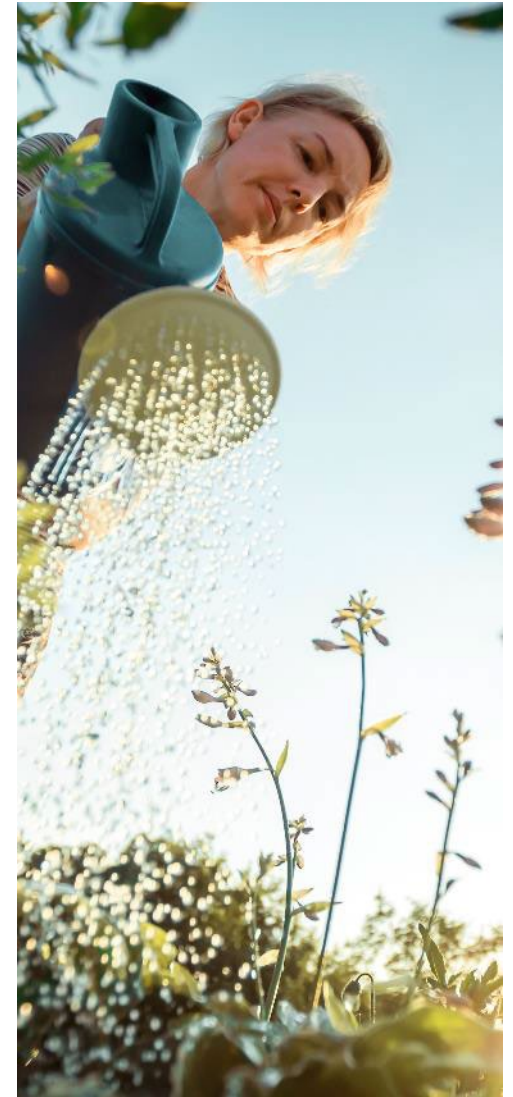
NV NRCS Urban Working Group

Equal Opportunity

- To File a Program Complaint

You may also write a letter containing all of the information requested in the form. Send your completed complaint form or letter to us by mail at U.S. Department of Agriculture, Director, Office of Adjudication, 1400 Independence Avenue, S.W., Washington, D.C. 20250-9410, by fax (202) 690-7442 or email at program.intake@usda.gov.
- Persons with Disabilities
 - Individuals who are deaf, hard of hearing or have speech disabilities and you wish to file either an EEO or program complaint please contact USDA through the Federal Relay Service at (800) 877-8339 or (800) 845-6136 (in Spanish).
 - Persons with disabilities who wish to file a program complaint, please see information above on how to contact us by mail directly or by email.
