Watershed Programs Update

Coon Creek and West Fork Kickapoo

- All 3 counties passed resolutions in support of the Watershed Plans-Programmatic Environmental Impact Statement and a Watershed Agreement to pursue implementation of plan.
- Decommissioning of 23 dams, rebuild of 1.
- Nathan has submitted a letter requesting funding authorization to the Chief.
- **Next step** is the development of Statements of Work and Independent Government Estimates for the **Design process** in anticipation of funding authorization and availability.
- Funding availability is unknown at this time. When funds become available, NRCS anticipates covering 100% of the design through an Architecture & Engineering contract.
- WFK total \$25 million, sponsor share \$545,000. CC \$4.2 million, sponsor share \$62,000.
- The County LCDs will be expected to conduct landowner negotiations with regards to the construction mobilization/methods incorporated into the design, and the final disposition of properties/easements.

Bear Creek

- The PIFR (Preliminary Investigations Findings Report) has been completed. A copy has been provided to the Sponsor, Outagamie County.
- Nathan has accepted the PIFR and has recommended moving forward into the Planning stage of the process.
- Steve and Adam to meet with Sponsors to discuss PIFR results.
- Seeking approximately \$1.5 million for planning study to determine if segregating urban vs ag drainage is feasible and how.
- Funding availability is unknown at this time. When funds become available, NRCS anticipates covering 100% of the planning through an Architecture & Engineering contract.

Kincaid/DNR WRE Easement

- 1600 acre restoration, \$5.5 million
- Notice to proceed to construction was issued 10/1/2024
- Performance time December 31, 2025
- 11 miles of dike construction
- 2 large sheet pile weirs
- 4 water management areas

Manawa Millpond Dam EWP (Emergency Watershed Protection Program)



- Heavy rains in July caused failure of millpond embankment, needs bank stabilization to protect downstream infrastructure (sanitary sewer lift station, business and library parking lots.
- DSR (Damage Survey Report) and request for funding have been submitted.
- Approval for funding coming sometime in mid-October at which time an agreement with the Sponsor, City of Manawa, will need to be executed.
- 180 ft of rock rip, 130 ft of sheet piling
- Concurrently, a Cultural Resources review of the site is being conducted.
