CRP Updates

- National acerate statutory cap = 27 M cap
- 25.9 M acres in CRP nationally
- Total national acres expiring = 956,313 on 9/30/2025
- NE was one of the three highest states in enrollment acres

o Continuous CRP Signup 63

- Signup started May 12, 2025
- · Offers will go through batch processing
- June 6 = deadline to submit for 1st batch processing
- Additional batching periods announces dependent on acreage availability
- Enrollment types: Continuous, CLEAR30, FWP, HELI, SAFE, Platte-Republican CREP
- Interim Conservation Plans are auth
- All contracts will have a 10/1/2025 start date

o General CRP Signup 64

- Signup: May 12 June 6, 2025
- Competitive process using ranking (EBI)
- Interim Conservation Plans are authorized
- All contracts will have a 10/1/2025 start date
- Land Eligibility Requirements for General CRP:
 - Planted to an ag commodity 4 of the 6 crop years 2012-2017
 - Meet one of the following:
 - Weighted average erodibility index of the 3 predominant soils is 8 or greater
 - Expiring CRP 9/30/2025 expiration
 - Located in a Conservation Priority Area
 - Same priority areas

o Payment Rates for FY25

- 3 Groupings
- No Inflationary for Climate Smart adjustment
- CLEAR30 reduced

No authority date for TIPS or Migratory Bird SAFE

o Approved Counties for ECP FY2025

- Keya Paha (June 2024 flooding)

HIGHLIGHTED Points:

o FY25 EQIP & CSP Implementation

- Nov 15, 2024 application deadline for all programs.
 - Ranking deadlines: EQIP IRA was Jan 31, 2025; EQIP General was Feb 28, 2025
 - Ranking deadlines: CSP IRA was April 1, 2025; EQIP General was April 18, 2025
 - No new IRA Obligations in FY25

General EQIP Farm Bill Fund Obligations

- 98% funds preapproved
- 78% of funds obligated

General CSP Farm Bill Fund Obligations

- 98% funds preapproved
- 48% of funds obligated
- General allocation breakout

• IRA Obligations

No new contracts executed using FY25 IRA funds

State Wildfire Initiative

- Managed using ACT NOW guidance.
- Application Deadline is June 6, 2025
- \$1.73M funds available
- Approved applications = almost \$1.62M
- Funded Practices: cover crops, prescribed grazing, mulching

• FY25 CSP Classic and Prior Year Funds

- \$13.4M currently being obligated (120 contracts)
- Also received \$9.9M prior year funds (70 additional CSP contracts)

- Alternative Funding Agreement with lead partner takes on the bulk of the administration
- NRCS responsible for the environmental evaluation

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FUNCTIONAL ASSESSMENT & MITIGATION TOOL: Lindsay Hovey – State Wetland Technical Specialist, NRCS

HIGHLIGHTED Points:

- O What is FAM?
 - Developed to assist in planning onsite and offsite wetland mitigation
 - For when a person wishes to restore a wetland or convert a wetland and move it somewhere else

Benefits

- Nationally consistent and defensible method to determine mitigation requirements
- Provides greater customer service with consistent and timely responses
- Considers multiple variables to quantify the quality of the wetlands

O What do we do?

- Assess & score project site
 - HydrologyConnectivityMicro-topographyProximity
 - Land useHydrogeomorphic (HGM)
 - Vegetation
- Functional Capacity Index deemed important by Congress
 - Wildlife habitat
 - Sequestration
 - Flood water storage
- Compare index scores to get a ratio for each of the wetland functions
- Tool calculates how many acres need to be mitigated to assure those functions are recovered

Q: What is the next step?

A: It will be posted on the eFOTG, and we will start to fully utilize the FAM tool.

Q: Do you pull the necessary information from map layers or do you go to individual sites.

A: We go onsite to measure and score these as well as GIS to understand the connectivity of wetlands in the area.

MASTER IRRIGATOR: Crystal Powers – Nebraska Extension

Master Irrigator vs. TAPS

- TAPS already existed in Nebraska
- Developing how we want this to look across a 5state region

Master Irrigator Themes

- Irrigation
- Soils & Fertility
- Protecting Nebraska's soil & water
- Transforming farm data into decisions
