

NRCS Partner Updates

Vermont Association of Conservation Districts

Vermont's Conservation Districts support conservation work by providing technical assistance to farmers and other landowners, helping them to identify conservation needs and areas where management changes can benefit their operation, as well as having a positive impact on resource conservation. This year, 13 of the districts will have local funding pools within the NRCS EQIP program to address conservation needs identified within their individual districts through a public process. Additionally, the districts assist with buffer installations, flood plain restorations, upgrading culverts, removing dams and other improvements needed to address the increase in intense storms and rainfall which Vermont is experiencing. Farm Service Agency

Vermont FSA has been focused on disaster recovery programs addressing the impacts of the 2023 and 2024 floods and continue to do so with the roll out of the Supplemental Disaster programs this summer and fall of 2025. Yet, Vermont FSA completed 15 offers for CRP under the continuous sign up this year under the number of acres allotted nationally with the last Farm Bill authorized ceiling. Without a new Farm Bill reauthorization of CRP and additional acreage added to the ceiling, we would then look to NRCS to do status and compliance reviews for the projects we have enrolled until those contracts expire, rather than help generating new offers. If CRP expansion were to occur, then development of offers under Grasslands CRP enrollments, may also be possible in addition to the current types of CRP usage.
