FSA ensures farm loans are available for producers who want to get started in productions agriculture or make investments in existing operations but are unable to obtain credit from private lenders. FSA offers a diverse portfolio of Direct and Guaranteed Ownership and Operating loans and provides loans to help producers recover from the impacts of natural disasters.

FSA conservation programs give landowners the tools and resources to protect environmentally sensitive land, restore grasslands and forests, leading to cleaner water and air, healthier soil and enhanced wildlife habitat.
