

What is RCPP?

The Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP) promotes coordination of NRCS conservation activities with partners that offer value-added contributions to expand our collective ability to address on-farm, watershed, and regional natural resource concerns. Through RCPP, NRCS seeks to coinvest with partners to implement projects that demonstrate innovative solutions to conservation challenges and provide measurable improvements and outcomes tied to the resource concerns they seek to address.

Project

Sand County Foundation will organize farmer-led networks to increase the adoption of water quality and climate-smart practices in prioritized watersheds. Goals include reaching 300 farmers new to NRCS programs installing soil health and cover crop practices on 60,000 acres, developing an innovative incentive payment structure, and ensuring 75 percent of RCPP-funded farmers continue these practices beyond project completion.

Eligible Practices

The project establishes an approach for private sector conservation planning support for practices such as:

- Conservation Cover
- Crop Rotation
- Cover Crops
- Nutrient Management
- Prescribed Grazing
- Reduced Tillage
