




FY16 ACEP- Agricultural Conservation Easement Program







FY16 Conservation Innovation Grants

NRCS selected three national CIG and six state CIG projects for Iowa in FY16. These grants help improve conservation implementation on ag land.

National Grants

Practical Farmers of Iowa (PFI): PFI will test a new model for conservation adoption to increase the number of acres of small grains grown as a third crop in the corn and soybean rotation Model will be tested in Iowa, Minnesota and Wisconsin. (\$400,912)

Prairie Rivers RC&D: This project will support the research and expansion of the Agricultural Conservation Planning Framework, a land use planning tool that optimizes the placement of conservation practices at the watershed level. The project will focus on two small watersheds which are part of the South Skunk watershed in central Iowa. (\$71,316)

Women Food and Agriculture Network: The grant focuses on reaching out to women who inherit land and helping build awareness, understanding and confidence in conservation decision making for their land. (\$533,124)

State Grants

Iowa NRCS selected five additional state-funded CIG projects for a total of \$325,000. NRCS is currently finalizing project agreements with each of these partners.

The Nature Conservancy (TNC): The Iowa Nitrate App: Enhancing the Delivery of the Retain Project (\$33,810)

The Soak Creek Watershed Management Authority (WMA): Woodland Health Objective—Gully Erosion (\$75,000)

Iowa Soybean Association (ISA): Adapting Saturated Buffers with a Sustaining Deep-Rooted Carbon Source (\$73,875)

Xerces Society: Demonstrating Insect-Ready Cropping Systems (\$66,922)

Practical Farmers of Iowa (PFI): Piloting a Rotationally Raised Corn and Soybean Supply Chain (\$74,465)
