List of Resource Conserving Crops – For the Conservation Crop Rotation (328) enhancements

- Perennial Grasses and Legumes- as monoculture or mixture:
 - Cool-season grasses: Kentucky bluegrass, orchardgrass, meadow fescue, perennial ryegrass, redtop, smooth brome, tall fescue, timothy
 - Perennial Legumes: Alfalfa, red clover, white clover, Bird's-foot trefoil
 - Biennial Legume: Sweet clover (yellow or white)

- Forbs/Legumes that are grown with a grass (grass is kept for 2 years)- Refer to 340 spec for complete list:
 - Forbs- brassicas (radish, turnip, rape, mustard), chicory, sunflower
 - Legumes- crimson clover, berseem clover

- Small grain grown in combination with a legume, forb, or a grass-forb mixture that is used as a green manure. **Cover crop must over-winter. Ensure the cover crop has generated sufficient biomass to address the resource concern as demonstrated by the erosion prediction tool results.**
 - Small Grains: Barley, Cereal Rye, Millet, Oats, Triticale, Wheat
 - Legumes for green manure: Austrian Winter Pea, Crimson Clover, Hairy Vetch, Red Clover, White Clover
 - Forbs for green manure: Brassicas (example: radish, turnip, rape, etc.), Chicory
