At 79% forested, N.H. is home to the most challenging stretch of the Appalachian Trail and the White Mountain National Forest. We have 48 peaks over 4,000 feet in elevation that await the explorer in you, and dozens of ski areas dot the tall peaks just waiting for you to hike, bike or carve some turns.

If you are more surf than turf, New Hampshire has 13 miles of coastline and one of the best boardwalks in America. A mixture of beaches, rocky coasts, inland tidal marshes and seaside towns mean you will forever see interesting scenery.
