NRCS Assistance Available for Stouts Creek Wildfire Recovery

USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) has funding now available to help farmers, ranchers and forest landowners recover from wildfire impacts on private agricultural and forest lands affected by the Stouts Creek Wildfire in Douglas County, Oregon.

NRCS is partnering with the South Umpqua Rural Community Partnership, the Oregon Department of Forestry, and the U.S. Forest Service to prioritize conservation practices and treatments in the areas with the most extreme fire severity on private lands.

Conservation practices will target erosion control measures that will promote vegetative cover and replanting of burned forestlands.
