The Regional Conservation Partnership
Program (RCPP) promotes coordination of
NRCS conservation activities with partners
that offer value-added contributions to expand
our collective ability to address on-farm,
watershed, and regional natural resource
concerns. Through RCPP, NRCS seeks to
co-invest with partners to implement projects
that demonstrate innovative solutions
to conservation challenges and provide
measurable improvements and outcomes tied
to the resource concerns they seek to address.

# **Partnership**

The Iowa Systems Approach to Conservation Drainage (ISACD) project will demonstrate a systems approach to improved farm profitability and sustainability in the Des Moines Lobe and Iowan Surface landforms. ISACD will substantially improve water quality, protect source water, reduce flood risk, and improve wildlife habitat and recreational opportunities while improving nutrient management and reducing nitrogen and phosphorus losses from non-point runoff.

## **Eligible Practices**

The project establishes an approach for private sector conservation planning support for practices such as:

- · Constructed Wetland
- Cover Crop
- Drainage Water Management
- Drainage Water Management Plan (CAP)
- Denitrifying Bioreactor
- Grassed Waterway
- Residue and Tillage Management, No Till
- Saturated Buffer
- Wetland Restoration (oxbow only)
