

#### **FY18 Iowa Partners in Conservation Projects**

lowa NRCS provided \$3 million to nine partners through ten lowa Partners in Conservation projects in FY18. These funds will be used to help support lowa NRCS mission areas and increase partner staff in local field offices. Following are a description of the top five agreements based on funding levels.

## Expanding Iowa's Private Lands Forestry Capacity Partner: Iowa Department of Natural Resources

Project will expand and accelerate delivery of direct technical assistance to landowners. (\$713,907)

# Putting it Together: An Innovative Approach to Increasing Iowa's Conservation Infrastructure Partner: Iowa Learning Farms

Project will result in improved soil health and water quality through conservation implementation. (\$450,000)

## Catfish Creek: Increasing Producer Leadership and Targeting Conservation Practices

### Partner: City of Dubuque

Project will increase producer engagement to reduce flooding and improve water quality in the Catfish Creek Watershed. (\$326,712)

### Indian Creek Soil Health Partnership

#### **Partner: Linn County**

Project will focus on conservation planning and soil health in the Indian Creek Watershed. (\$306,500)
