

Ducks Unlimited Prairie Pothole Region Working Lands RCPP Project

This Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP) project provides an opportunity for Montana's producers in Blaine and Phillips counties to manage their working lands in a way that is compatible with agricultural production and good stewardship. Financial assistance is available for the project through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) to:

- Utilize the grassland resource of expired Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) for grass-based agriculture,
- Restore marginally productive croplands back to grasslands and wetlands,
- Improve the management of working lands for agricultural production while minimizing impacts to natural resources, and
- Sustain intact grasslands and wetlands in their current condition.

When can landowners apply?

Deadline for applications is April 19, 2019.

Landowners in Blaine and Phillips counties

- Crop
- Pasture
- Associated Agriculture Lands

Benefits to the Land

- Facilitate livestock grazing where infrastructure (e.g. fencing and watering facilities) is limited or non-existent
- Converting marginal cropland to grass and managing for grazing and wildlife habitat
- · Reduced soil erosion
- · Improved soil, water, and forage quality
- Retention of existing grasslands and wetlands
