CONSERVATION STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM

1. A perennial grass. Grasses that meet this criterion are:

A. Cool Season Grasses

- o Fescue, Tall
- o Fescue, Turf-Type Tall
- o Garrison Creeping Foxtail
- o Kentucky bluegrass
- o Orchardgrass
- o Perennial Ryegrass

- o Reed Canarygrass
- o Smooth Bromegrass
- o Timothy
- o Wildrye, Canadian
- o Wildrye, Virginia

B. Warm Season Grasses

- o Big Bluestem
- o Little Bluestem
- o Eastern Gamagrass
- o Indiangrass
- o Switchgrass

2. A legume grown for use as forage, seed for planting, or green manure. Legumes that meet this criterion are:

A. Cool Season Legumes

- o Alfalfa
- o Alsike Clover
- o Birdsfoot Trefoil
- o Crownvetch

- o Kura Clover
- o Red Cover
- o White Clover

B. Warm Season Legumes

- o Lespedeza

3. A legume-grass mixture. Grass/legumes mixes would include a mixture of 1 and 2 above.

4. A small grain grown in combination with a grass or legume, whether interseeded or planted in rotation. Small grains that meet this criterion are:

- o Wheat
- o Rye
- o Oats

- o Tridicale
- o Barley
